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Nancy Verga and Michael Ivey re-elected to Morris Plains Borough Council

MORRIS PLAINS - Incumbent Democratic Councilwoman Nancy Verga and Councilman Michael Ivey won re-election to the Morris Plains Borough Council on Tuesday, Nov. 4.

The following numbers are from unofficial results reported by the Morris County Clerk's office as of 10:19 p.m.

Verga received 1,980 votes and Ivey received 1,914 votes. They faced Republican candidates Ann Bono and Anthony Tonini, who received 1,444 and 1,439 votes, respectively.

Morris Plains residents also decisively voted "no" to a public question asking whether the borough council should spend no more than \$12 million to renovate the existing police department headquarters or build a new headquarters on Tabor Road. The estimated tax impact for the average homeowner in Morris Plains would have been approximately \$253 for 20 years.



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1,829 residents voted "no," while 1,260 voted "yes."

In the uncontested races for three seats on the grades K-8 Morris Plains School District Board of Education, Christina Perry, Adam Higgins and Maria Manley received 2,054, 2,024, and 2,118 votes, respectively.
