MORRIS PLAINS - Three candidates filed to run for two three-year seats on the Borough Council by the deadline Monday, March 30.

Democrat Cara Parmigiani will face Republican Councilmen Salvatore Cortese and Arthur Bruhn in the Tuesday, Nov. 2 general election.

Cortese is seeking a third three-year term and Bruhn, now council president, a second one. Both ran unopposed in 2017.

Parmigiani, a lawyer at her own firm in Mountain Lakes, ran for the Morris County Board of Freeholders last year.

In early 2019, she was one of three candidates chosen by the Morris Plains Democratic Committee as possibilities to fill the remaining year of the unexpired term of former Councilman Jason Karr, a Democrat who was elected mayor in 2018. Joan Goddard was selected for the council at that time.
