Joan has been active in the community and served as a member of the Chilton Memorial Hospital Board of Trustees for 16 years, as well as the Board of Directors of Eva's Village in Paterson for 12 years and is currently a member of the Board of Trustees of DePaul Catholic High School. Additionally, she is the President of the Trinity Washington University Alumane/i Board of Trustees on which she has served for 16 years. She is an active member of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church and is a long-time choir member and lector.

Joan became involved in politics in New Jersey in the early 1970s and worked in many national, state, county, and local elections. She served as Wayne Township Democratic Municipal Leader for several years and ran unsuccessfully for Passaic County Freeholder in '91 and '92, NJ Assembly in 1995, and the state Senate in '97. She was elected to the Wayne Township Council in 2001 and served a 4-year term.

Joan is the proud mother of three accomplished children and the loving grandmother of six grandchildren. She moved to Pompton Plains in 2011 following the passing of her beloved husband, David Waks, a long time Wayne councilman and Wayne Mayor. She enjoys her life there with her Australian Labradoodle, Murphy, and is ready for a new Journey, to bring her many skills to Trenton to ensure that our voices in LD26 are heard in the State Senate.
